



## **PUBLIC MEETING NOTICE**

### **Douglas County Heritage Conservation Council Historic Building Survey Project Marion Township/Willow Springs Twp.**

Dear Property Owner,

The Douglas County Heritage Conservation Council will conduct a reconnaissance historic resources survey in the northern portion of Marion Township and the western portion of Willow Springs Township this spring and summer. This is an initial historic building survey.

The study consists of two basic components, a field survey and project report. Historic preservation consultant Stan Hernly will conduct this survey under the supervision of the Douglas County Heritage Conservation Council – an advisory council appointed by the Douglas County Commission. The field work will be conducted by Stan Hernly, Joni Hernly, and/or Susan Ford. The survey project will focus on properties that are at least 50 years old. The goal is to identify buildings and structures that are architecturally and historically significant, as well as natural resources that influenced cultural development.
